SUBJ: DCP 3 11NR Report for JUNE 2008

- **Flotilla 31:** Flotilla 31 has elected a new FC - Rory Neumann who was VFC, due to the resignation of Robert Albain, who stepped down for personal reasons. The new VFC is Ron Clark.
- **Member Training:** A schedule of Specialty Course offerings has been emailed to Division 3 members. AUXCOM and AUXWEA are underway, to be followed next month by AUXSEA. Search and Rescue will be offered in the fall. AUXACN may also be offered again in the fall of 2008.
- **Comms:** A Communication Workshop was held on 14 JUN 08 by Jeff Price DSO-CM. The workshop was attended by more than a dozen members from Division 3, and the consensus was that they learned a great deal.
- **Public Education:** Flotilla 35 has completed the 13 week BS&S class for the Cal Boating staff, and we plan to offer several one day ABS classes during the summer months, with the next one on JULY 12.
- **Marine Safety:** Several members from FL 35 remain active assisting the REC. Several members expressed interest in getting trained as forensic document examiners at the next available training.
- **Vessel Examinations:** Our SO-VE has planned several VSC stations along the Sacramento River over the next few months. He is also planning a National Marina Day event at the Sacramento Marina (Miller Park).
- **Operations:** Division 3 has at least one remaining OPTREX scheduled for 2008: The Sacramento Radio One OPTREX, which was scheduled for 20-22 June, will be rescheduled for the fall or will be cancelled. The Lake Oroville OPTREX - scheduled for 13 September will be cancelled due to low water levels, and the Brannan Island OPTREX will be held 17-19 October. Patrols continue to be impeded by a lack of OPFACs. The request for vessels to patrol the Sacramento River Racing Festival has been cancelled due to withdrawal by the organizer.
- **Sacramento Radio One Dock Project:** Several members from Division 3 assisted in installing a new I beam to help support the new floating docks. Grant High School is turning over the management of the facility to the City of Sacramento, who appears to be supportive of what we do for

the community. The plans are to have the docks operational by early July.
